DZIDZIO is a Ukrainian band mainly known for a comedic bent to their music but what follows is deadly serious. I (Ted) think the origin of the poem is from a project done about a year ago described below (with the help of Google translation). **Be sure to follow the link after you read it -- absolutely beautiful.**

"DZIDZIO prayed for Ukraine Mykhailo Khoma (DZIDZIO) together with the Youth Symphony Orchestra of Ukraine under the direction of conductor Oksana Lyniv a few months ago began working on the project "National Anthem of Ukraine". The work continued in the Kiev Recording House, the only place in Ukraine where you can simultaneously record more than a hundred musicians and choristers. While working on the National Anthem, Mikhail also had the idea to record the Spiritual Hymn of Ukraine "God is great, the only one, we keep Ukraine". It was unrealistic to do this in such a short time, but Mykhailo insisted: "In the process of preparing for the project "National Anthem of Ukraine" at some point, I realized that I must necessarily record the Spiritual Anthem of Ukraine." We have a wonderful team together with young talented musicians from all over Ukraine and the prayer "God is great, one..." they performed with me for the first time" Work on "Prayer" ended on a special day - for the Annunciation. The director of the video was a long-time friend of Mikhail - Vladimir Shurubura. The main location was chosen a landmark of history and spirituality St. Sophia Cathedral (St. Sophia Cathedral), a place of special spiritual strength to protect the people of Ukraine. "Prayer for Ukraine" is an unearthly super-powerful force that will help all Ukrainians to go through these difficult times that have now fallen on the fate of Ukraine and the whole world. Give him freedom, give him fate, give him a good world, Happiness, God, people, and many, many years! ..."
