

## Meet The Reverend Deborah Woolsey



Rev. Deborah Woolsey grew up in the small town of Waupaca, located in central Wisconsin, where she and her family were active members of St. Mark's Episcopal Church. Deborah's father is a master plumber who started his own plumbing business when Deborah was five years old.
